On November 13, Valley College held a ribbon cutting ceremony to mark the official opening of the \$13.6 million Student Services Center and Anex. A crowd of 250 Valley College students, faculty, architects, local residents, and Los Angeles Community College District Officials were in attendance.

The 37,000 square foot complex will be the one-stop place for students to take care off college needs including Admissions & Records, Financial Aid, Placement and Assessment Centers, and the Associated Student Union.

LACCD Chancellor Daniel LaVista said that bringing all these services together under one roof will promote student access and retention. Trustee Georgia Mercer called the building a time and energy saver.

The building was designed by Steinberg Architects and built by JD Diffenbaugh. It received the Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design Certificate from the U.S. Green Building Council. Its green features include a "cool roof" to reduce heat as well as an efficient water usage system.

Nordmann Endowment Expands

Retired Chemistry Prof will also award Biology Assistantships



In September, retired Valley College Chemistry Department Chair Joseph Nordmann informed the Valley College

Foundation that the Nordmann Endowment (managed by the LAVC Foundation) will be awarding student assistantships annually for the Biology department.

Faculty may have students assist them in classrooms, office, or labs and the Nordmann endowment will provide an award to the student for doing so.

In 2005, Nordmann established a \$20,000 endowment that initially provided funding for Chemistry Department Assistantships. Nordmann has been making annual gifts to the endowment, which now totals over \$125,000.

Professor Nordmann retired from Valley College in 1978 and resides in northern California. He enjoys painting, which is one of his great passions. Nordmann has never forgotten about Valley College and occasionally visits the campus.

After studying journalism at LAVC in 1984 and 1985, Stassel-Bluestein earned a B.A. in journalism from California State University, Northridge, in 1988. SCHOLARSHIPS

The LAVC Foundation has awarded nearly \$147,000 so far this year in student scholarships and awards. Foundation Executive Director Raul Castillo projects that it will award well-over \$152,000 by the end of the fiscal year, which will be June 30.

Students will be eligible to apply for Foundation Scholarships beginning January 21, 2011. With a deadline of March 18, applications will then be submitted to committees for selection. Recipients receive their award in late August just before the fall semester.
